Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival into Dublin. Panoramic sightseeing tour followed by a visit to the Guinness Storehouse and Trinity College to see the Book of Kells. Welcome dinner at a local pub to enjoy Irish fare.

Day 2: Full day excursion to Powerscourt Estate and the medieval city of Kilkenny.

Day 3: Travel to Belfast via the burial site of St Patrick. Panoramic sightseeing tour of Belfast followed by a visit to Titanic Belfast.

Day 4: Full day excursion around the Causeway Coast visiting Game of Thrones filming locations, Carrick-A-Rede Rope Bridge, Giant's Causeway and Bushmills distillery.

Day 5: Travel to Londonderry/Derry. Welcome tea, followed by a guided walking tour and visits to the visitor's centre, Guildhall, Derry Girls Exhibition and Museum of Free Derry. Dinner at a local brewery.

Day 6: Full day excursion to explore the north coast of the Wild Atlantic Way. Travel through the Glenveagh National Park to Ardara and the Triona Donegal Tweed Centre followed by Donegal Castle.

Day 7: Travel back to Dublin. Enjoy some free time to explore the city before a final farewell dinner.
